CARAVANE Final Festival – Málaga

The Final Festival takes place in Málaga, hosting a diverse programme of performances, exhibitions, screenings, and public encounters. Artistic works presented during the festival emerge from laboratories, exchanges, and workshops carried out across partner countries, reflecting the variety of approaches and perspectives developed within CARAVANE.

A defining feature of the festival is its emphasis on process rather than product. Participants present not only artistic outcomes, but also reflections on collaboration, experimentation, and collective creation. Audiences are invited to engage with the stories behind the works, gaining insight into how artistic practices evolve through dialogue, movement, and shared experience.

The festival also functions as a meeting point for participants who have taken part in different phases of the project. Artists, facilitators, and cultural practitioners reconnect, exchange reflections, and revisit shared experiences. These encounters reinforce the sense of community built throughout CARAVANE and highlight the continuity between earlier exchanges and the final public presentation.

Public engagement plays a central role during the festival. Activities are designed to be accessible and welcoming, encouraging audiences from diverse backgrounds to participate. Informal conversations, discussions, and moments of shared presence complement the artistic programme, creating an open atmosphere that supports dialogue and mutual understanding.

By situating the final festival in Málaga, CARAVANE connects local audiences with the project's wider European journey. The festival highlights the transnational nature of the project while remaining grounded in a specific local context, demonstrating how global climate-related concerns intersect with place-based cultural expression.

The CARAVANE Final Festival represents a moment of collective recognition and shared closure. It brings visibility to the relationships, practices, and learning processes developed throughout the project, while reaffirming CARAVANE's commitment to co-creation, inclusion, and dialogue.

Rather than marking an endpoint, the festival underscores the continuation of ideas and connections beyond the project's formal duration. The experiences shared in Málaga contribute to a lasting legacy rooted in collaboration, artistic exchange, and sustained engagement with climate-related themes across cultural and civic contexts.
