Closing Public Events & Project Completion Phase

This final newsletter reflects on the closing public events and the project completion phase of CARAVANE – Climate Art Fusion. These concluding moments provide spaces for collective reflection, dialogue, and the sharing of experiences developed across the project's activities.

The completion phase is not approached as a simple conclusion, but as an opportunity to revisit the CARAVANE journey, acknowledge shared learning, and connect project experiences with wider audiences and communities.

Across partner countries, CARAVANE organises a series of closing public events that bring together participants, partners, and local audiences. These events take different forms, including presentations, discussions, exhibitions, and informal gatherings, ensuring openness and accessibility for diverse publics.

The closing events create opportunities to reflect on artistic processes, collaborations, and thematic explorations developed throughout the project. Participants share experiences from exchanges, laboratories, and festivals, emphasising how dialogue, movement, and co-creation have shaped their engagement with climate-related issues.

A strong focus is placed on collective reflection. Rather than highlighting final results alone, the completion phase encourages discussion about processes, challenges, and learning experiences. This approach allows participants and audiences to consider how artistic practice can contribute to broader conversations on climate awareness and civic engagement.

Public participation remains central during this phase. Audiences are invited to engage with the project's themes and narratives, extending CARAVANE's reach beyond its immediate participant groups. These encounters support the circulation of ideas and experiences across different social and cultural contexts.

The completion phase also provides space to acknowledge the relationships built throughout the project. Encounters between partners, participants, and local communities reinforce the sense of a shared journey and highlight the importance of trust, mutual respect, and collaboration within transnational cultural initiatives.

The project completion phase highlights CARAVANE's enduring contribution: a network of relationships, shared practices, and collaborative approaches to climate awareness. While formal activities come to an end, the project's impact continues through the people, ideas, and connections it has brought together.

CARAVANE's legacy lies not only in documented outputs, but in the collective experiences and capacities developed across countries and communities. These foundations support continued artistic engagement, dialogue, and cooperation on climate-related issues beyond the lifespan of the project.
