CARAVANE Within Creative Europe: Funding, Responsibility, and Legacy

CARAVANE as a Creative Europe–Funded Project

CARAVANE – Climate Art Fusion is funded by Creative Europe, enabling the project to bring together partners, artists, and participants from multiple countries. This support allows the project to function transnationally, connecting local contexts with broader European perspectives.

Creative Europe funding provides the structural stability necessary to design laboratories, exchanges, festivals, and public events over time. It supports planning, coordination, and implementation, ensuring that activities are accessible, inclusive, and ethically grounded.

The funding framework also reinforces responsibility. CARAVANE operates within clearly defined contractual and reporting obligations, ensuring

transparent and accountable use of public funds. This reinforces trust between institutions, partners, and participants.

Creative Europe support enables CARAVANE to prioritise process over output. Activities are designed to allow time for dialogue, experimentation, and relationship-building, rather than focusing solely on final results.

Inclusion is a key dimension of this support. Funding allows CARAVANE to engage young people, emerging artists, and participants with limited access to international cultural platforms, reducing barriers to participation.

Creative Europe also supports the project's dissemination activities. Newsletters, publications, exhibitions, and public events ensure that CARAVANE's experiences and reflections reach audiences beyond the immediate participant groups.

Ethical responsibility is embedded in the project through the funding framework. CARAVANE applies codes of conduct, data protection measures, and consent procedures that align with European standards and values.

The programme further encourages sustainability beyond the project's formal duration. By supporting networks, shared methodologies, and transnational cooperation, Creative Europe enables CARAVANE to contribute to long-term cultural connections.

Through this framework, CARAVANE becomes part of a broader European narrative, where culture serves as a space for addressing climate challenges, social change, and collective responsibility.
