## *Climate Art Fusion*

### **Climate Awareness Through Artistic Practice**

This newsletter focuses on climate awareness through artistic practice, a core thematic orientation of CARAVANE. Rather than promoting advocacy or predefined messages, the project approaches climate as a lived, cultural, and relational experience.

Art functions as a space for reflection, complexity, and dialogue, allowing participants to engage with climate issues in nuanced and personal ways.

### **Climate Awareness in CARAVANE**

CARAVANE treats climate change as a condition shaping everyday life rather than an abstract concept. Artistic practice becomes a means of exploring how climate is felt, remembered, and negotiated.

Participants engage with climate-related themes through visual arts, performance, storytelling, and embodied practices. These approaches allow emotional and sensory engagement alongside intellectual reflection.

The project avoids didactic narratives. Instead of instructing audiences or participants, CARAVANE creates space for ambiguity, questioning, and multiple interpretations.

Climate awareness emerges through process. Site-specific exploration, observation, and dialogue allow participants to connect environmental concerns with local contexts.

Artistic experimentation enables participants to express uncertainty and contradiction, recognising that climate issues are complex and emotionally charged.

Public exhibitions and festivals extend this approach to audiences, inviting reflection rather than persuasion.

Climate is explored alongside social and cultural dimensions, acknowledging the interconnectedness of environmental challenges with identity, memory, and coexistence.

By prioritising reflection over advocacy, CARAVANE maintains openness and inclusivity in its engagement with climate themes.

This approach supports deeper understanding by allowing participants and audiences to form their own connections and interpretations.

### **Epilogue – Art as a Space for Climate Reflection**

CARAVANE's approach to climate awareness demonstrates how art can foster reflection without simplification. By embracing complexity, the project contributes to a cultural understanding of climate rooted in experience and dialogue.

This perspective continues through the practices and networks formed within the project.
