CARAVANE as a Network Beyond the Project

This newsletter reflects on CARAVANE as a network that extends beyond the formal duration of the project. While the funded activities reach completion, the relationships, shared practices, and forms of collaboration developed through CARAVANE continue to evolve.

CARAVANE is understood not as a closed initiative, but as a space of encounter and cooperation that leaves behind connections, shared experiences, and a common language for artistic and civic engagement around climate-related themes.

CARAVANE Beyond the Project

Throughout its implementation, CARAVANE brings together participants, facilitators, and partner organisations across multiple countries. These encounters create relationships grounded in shared experience, collaboration, and mutual trust.

Time spent working together in laboratories, exchanges, festivals, and public events contributes to bonds that extend beyond individual activities. Participants remain connected through shared memories, ongoing communication, and continued interest in one another's practices.

CARAVANE also supports the development of shared methodologies. Approaches to co-creation, facilitation, emotional safety, and collaborative experimentation become reference points that participants carry into future projects and contexts.

The network formed through CARAVANE is not formalised as a fixed structure. Instead, it remains flexible and open, allowing connections to develop organically according to participants' interests, capacities, and circumstances.

Documentation plays an important role in sustaining the network. Publications, e-books, newsletters, and visual materials provide shared reference points that preserve collective memory and allow experiences to be revisited over time.

These materials also function as tools for continuity. They enable participants to communicate CARAVANE's values and approaches within other cultural, educational, or community settings.

Importantly, the continuation of the network does not rely solely on institutional frameworks or future funding. It is sustained through relationships, trust, and shared understanding developed during the project.

Participants remain connected by a common language around care, collaboration, and climate reflection. This shared vocabulary supports future encounters and collaborations, even when contexts change.

The network also remains open to new connections. CARAVANE's legacy is not limited to those directly involved, but extends through dissemination, public events, and shared practices that invite further dialogue.

Through this openness, CARAVANE continues to exist as a point of reference rather than a concluded activity.

Epilogue – A Living and Evolving Network

CARAVANE's most enduring legacy is the network it creates. This network is composed not only of contacts, but of shared values, working methods, and ways of engaging with climate and cultural cooperation.

As participants move forward into new projects and contexts, the experiences and relationships developed through CARAVANE continue to inform their practices. In this way, CARAVANE remains present as a living, evolving network that extends beyond the lifespan of the project itself.
