Care, Ethics, and Responsibility in Cultural Cooperation

This newsletter addresses care, ethics, and responsibility as integral dimensions of CARAVANE. Ethical considerations are embedded throughout the project rather than treated as administrative obligations.

CARAVANE recognises that cultural cooperation involves responsibility toward participants, audiences, and public funding frameworks.

Ethical responsibility begins with emotional safety. CARAVANE creates environments where respect, consent, and care are prioritised.

Codes of conduct establish shared expectations and accountability mechanisms across all activities.

Data protection and informed consent are treated with seriousness, ensuring participants' personal and creative contributions are safeguarded.

Facilitators actively monitor group dynamics to prevent exclusion or harm. Care extends to pacing and workload, recognising emotional and physical limits. Responsibility is shared collectively rather than delegated to individuals alone.

Ethical reflection remains ongoing, adapting to contexts and participants' needs. This approach strengthens trust and transparency within the project.

CARAVANE demonstrates that ethics are not constraints, but enabling conditions for meaningful collaboration and participation.
